## University Export Control Program Export Control Determination

The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) requires an export control review and certification. A section has been added requiring certification that any technology or technical data released to a prospective H-1B, H-1B1 (Chile & Singapore), L-1, or O-1A visa applicant during the period of his/her employment will or will not require a license from the U.S. Department of Commerce or the U.S. Department of State. In order to complete the I-129, export control issues must be assessed by the Responsible Party who will be supervising the foreign national employee/applicant.

A basic export control training module is also available at <a href="https://orcbs.arizona.edu/train">https://orcbs.arizona.edu/train</a>. Form I-129 states you must "certify" you reviewed the export regulations and determined that a license is required or is not required.
