Satisfy your **International Immersion Requirement** by spending a semester or academic year in tropical Mauritius, where you can choose from a range of courses that are pre-approved to satisfy Global Studies major requirements. All courses are taught in English, but you will get to hear French and Mauritian Creole in informal settings while living in this multicultural island nation.

The University of Arizona's partnership with the University of Mauritius offers students an enhanced study abroad experience where you will take courses alongside local students, while also feeling the support and connection to the Wildcat community.

At UA Mauritius, you'll pay your regular UArizona tuition and be able to use your financial aid, including **AZ Excellence** and **Wildcat Excellence Awards** in the fall and spring semesters.
